## Central Okanagan Public Schools Communicable Disease Plan Q&A

## Q. What are the recent changes?

#### A. See below:

- The Ministry of Education has updated the <u>Provincial COVID-19 Communicable Disease</u> <u>Guidelines for K-12 Settings</u>. That document is the foundational document to our own district Communicable Disease Plan and related site procedure found on this page.
- The district Plan and related site procedure have been reviewed/updated.

#### Q. Are masks required anywhere?

**A.** Masks are not required. Decision to wear a mask or face covering is a personal choice. A person's choice is to be supported and respected. Non-medical masks are available for those who have forgotten theirs but would like to wear one, or who become ill at school.

#### Q. If a staff/student is diagnosed with COVID-19, how long before they return to work/school?

**A.** As per the BCCDC, people with symptoms who test positive for COVID-19 should stay home until their fever has resolved and they feel well enough to participate in regular activities .

If you are unsure or concerned, consider contacting with your health care provider, calling 8-1-1, or going to an Urgent and Primary Health Care Centre to be assessed.

#### Q. Is Public Heath doing contact tracing?

**A.** As per the BCCDC, close contacts are not required to self-isolate or take any special measures. Therefore, contact tracing is of limited value except for high-priority settings (e.g. Long term care facilities). SD23 facilities are not considered high-priority settings.

#### Q. Will schools (including staff and students) be notified if there is an exposure at school?

**A.** No. Schools will only be notified in the event of an official outbreak being declared by Public Health. If a parent/guardian calls indicating their child is diagnosed with COVID-19, schools are not required to provide a list of names as to that student's contacts while at school.

#### Q. What is required when a staff/student is diagnosed with COVID-19?

**A.** Stay home and away from others until your fever is gone and you feel well enough to participate in daily activities. Staff diagnosed with COVID-19 are **not** required to contact all their school related contacts. # Q. What do staff and students do if they are informed they are close contacts with someone who was recently diagnosed with COVID-19?

**A.** You are not required to self-isolate, and you can continue to participate in routine activities, such as work or school, as long as you do not have any symptoms. If you are not showing any <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u>, you do not need to be tested, unless you are asked to by Public Health. #### Q. Are there any travel related restrictions.

**A.** At this time there are no travel restrictions, however that can change any time. Prior to any travel check this COVID-19: Travel, testing and borders page for updated information.

#### Q. Are there any restrictions on athletic events or other gatherings/events?

A. No.

## Q. Site Communicable Disease Plan?

**A.** Each school/site must maintain its Site Communicable Disease Procedure. That procedure must be reviewed at least annually and done in consultation with the site JOHSC - based on the District's Communicable Disease Plan. Both templates can be found on this <u>page</u>. Post the site plan at/near the front office reception, onthe JOHSC board, and on school website.

Staff must be orientated to both the District's plan as well as their school/site's plan. If visiting anothersite you must orientate yourself with that site's plan before entering the site.

#### Q. Visitor entry requirements?

**A.** Staff, students, and visitors perform a <u>Daily Health Check</u>. Ensure Daily Health Check document is posted at reception and on school website. All district sites/schools should maintain a <u>SD23</u> <u>Visitor's/Employee's Sign-In Booklet</u> at or near the front office. All visitor's (including visiting staff) should sign that booklet and review the site-based H&S information documented in that booklet.

#### Q. Is Physical Distancing required?

**A.** No. Staff and students should be encouraged to respect others' personal space (the distance from which a person feels comfortable being next to another person).

#### Q. Cleaning and Disinfection?

**A.** Cleaning and disinfection of frequently touched surfaces should occur at least once in a 24-hour period and when visibly dirty. Building occupants are expected to hand wash/sanitize often.

#### Q. Food Restrictions?

A. Food delivery both curricular and non-curricular as per normal delivery model.

There is no prohibition on **homemade food**. While homemade food is not recommended by H&S, school administration/site management can decide whether homemade food is permissible at their own school/facility. Where homemade is permitted, school admin/management must ensure its use is also consistent with the <u>Guidelines for Food and Beverage Sales in B.C. Schools</u> and <u>Admin Procedure 'Food Services in Schools' (Public)</u>.

#### Q. Hand sanitizing?

**A.** No change. Continue with frequent handwashing/sanitizing.

#### Q. Sneeze/cough etiquette?

**A.** No change. Continue with sneeze/cough etiquette.

#### Q. Classroom seating plans required?

**A.** As per pre-pandemic requirements. No additional requirements related to public health.

#### Q. How will I know if there are local or regional recommendations or Orders?

**A.** If a local or regional recommendation or Order is in place that impacts the school district the recommendation or Order will be added to Appendix 7 of the Communicable Disease Plan, and communicated out to all school administrators/management by district H&S.
